## Certification as a Dyslexia Practitioner 1

Cost: \$6,000 value, but is free except nominal fee of \$300 for books and materials.

**Butler University affiliation** for graduate college credit which is optional and at your expense.

Tutor training program is approved by the Indiana Department of Education.

Bachelor's Degree required, in any field.

- Course Hours
  - o 90 Course Hours (60 of those are seat time seminars)
  - 5 Observation Hours (observing an experienced tutor)
- 100 Hours of Supervised Practicum, approximately 10 months to complete
  - o Trainees tutor 2 children individually for 50-minute tutoring sessions twice a week (a total of 4 sessions per week). Sessions are Tuesday/Thursday at 3:30, 4:40, 5:50 pm.
  - o Lesson preparation time is approximately 1 hour for each lesson, which is done at home.
  - o All lessons must be submitted PRIOR to tutoring the student.
- 6 formal, graded observations conducted by the training supervisor
- Completion of all coursework with 85% or higher
  - Mandatory book reports
  - o Quizzes and exams
  - o Graded assignments
  - Exit portfolio: 2 lesson plans with written work from 2 different children, brief description of each child, lesson plan recording forms, curriculum order list, narrative progress report.

## Steps to get the process started, include, but are not limited to:

- 1) Visit the learning Center, meet with the director, observe a lesson.
- 2) Fill out a training application.
- 3) Return the application, as well as proof of Bachelor level education, current resume, and 2 letters of recommendations (dated within the past 2 years) to Children's Dyslexia Center of Indianapolis.
